

Care For The Courses: Please help us keep your golf course in its best possible condition: please repair your ball mark plus one other on every green. Sometimes you may have to check the front of the green to find your pitch mark. If the mark is not repaired immediately, it could take up to 2 weeks to heal. Please replace your divots or fill the divot with the sand mixture provided on your golf car. It is critical this time of year that we care for the course in this manner as these practices directly affect the course conditions for the Arnold Palmer Invitational. Each year the PGA Tour asks us to place greater limits on the amount of play we allow leading up to the event. If we can minimize the wear and tear on the course and the regeneration time for ball marks and divots, hopefully we can eliminate the need for further play limitations.

"Cart Path Only" Restrictions will be in place for the month of February. This is the perfect time of year to walk the golf course: cool weather, great turf conditions, thick rough (when walking it is easier to track your line to the ball) and you may still be working on your New Year's resolution to exercise more often.

ARNOLD PALMER CUP

December 21-23, 2020

We were fortunate to host 48 of the top college players in the world for the annual mixed team event, originally scheduled for June in Ireland at Lahinch Golf Club. When Covid concerns forced a venue change due to the travel restrictions in the spring and summer, the Saunders family stepped in to offer Bay Hill as the host venue – the event's first return since the inaugural matches in 1997.

The stellar play of the International Team over the first two days made the outcome a foregone conclusion during the final day singles matches. The International's successfully defended the cup by a final score of 40.5 to 19.5. Part of the tradition of the matches is a special API exemption awarded, by vote of his teammates, to the player who best exemplifies the character of Mr. Palmer. Matthias Schmid will be representing his fellow collegians at this year's event.

Walker Cup Practice Session December 16-18, 2020

Prior to the Arnold Palmer Cup, Bay Hill served as host site for the Walker Cup Practice Session. Our facility was ideal for this event by virtue of our ability to provide the necessary ingredients for a "Covid-free bubble". The Walker Cup is a Ryder Cup-style event featuring the best amateur golfers from the U.S. against their counterparts in Great Britain & Ireland. The practice session presented an opportunity for the USGA to cull their prospective group of 16 players down to the 10 players representing the U.S. team in the

matches held at Seminole Golf Club, May 8-9.

KEEPIN' IT GREEN

As we draw near to tournament time, we focus heavily on staff training for specific areas of responsibility. There are certain jobs where a high level of creativity is most definitely required and then there are jobs on the other end of the spectrum that require little or no creativity. But there is a third category that actually requires some creativity, but only to a certain point - a point that, if exceeded, could end up with a rather negative impact. A great example of this type of job is that of the golf course cup cutter.

Cutting cups is not a job for just anyone. As mentioned, creativity is needed, but so is a strong sense of restraint – knowing when to hold back. Those who cut cups on golf courses (and do it well) must have a strong attention to detail, knowledge of the game of golf, a good eye, and as mentioned, that streak of creativity. Ideally, a cup cutter also will possess some scouting attributes with scouting of disease, insects and general greens conditions.

Of all the people I have trained to cut cups over the years, I'd say about three in 10 actually have had what it takes to do the job well. It is simply too important to be left to chance. It is a job each and every golfer judges (even if subconsciously) as they walk off each and every green. And often they voice this opinion to their playing partners; "That pin was too hard," "That putt didn't break as much as I thought" or "Was that pin fair?"

Creativity within cup cutting comes from the aspect of choosing the pin location. The ability to bring into play slopes on the green as well as areas off the green, like water hazards, bunkers and false fronts. The restraint of creativity mentioned earlier is crucial here. Just as you don't want boring cups, you surely don't want 18 diabolical ones either. Put one or two near a slope (not on a slope). Tuck one or two on an edge near a bunker or water hazard. But make them fair, and balance this out with some good old boring, middle-of-the-green, flat-location pins. Having a cup cutter that is a golfer is positively essential.

In the end, there are two ways to look at the job of cutting cups on a golf course. One, you can consider it just one of many morning duties that must be accomplished, and put no more thought into who is doing it than you do for daily bunker raking or string trimming. Or two, consider it one of the most essential and pivotal jobs you assign each day, making sure you have the very best person doing the job.




