As always, this year's tournament proved to be a challenging competition that came down to the wire as the sun was setting on the 18th green. Ultimately it was Bryson DeChambeau (-11) who emerged as champion as he edged out Lee Westwood by one stroke to win. Bryson made headlines earlier in the week by driving the par 5 hole #6 across the lake but it was his all-around game that earned him the win. Bryson's final round 71 was one of only three under par rounds on the day. The win marks the eighth victory of his career on the PGA TOUR and his first at Bay Hill.







Another API is in the books and I could not be more proud of my team. I honestly feel that over the winter months leading into tournament we had the best turf conditions since I have been here. So many factors play into that but without a doubt – the commitment and hard work by my staff is the driving factor.

This past year has certainly provided us all with many unique challenges. In preparing for the Arnold Palmer Invitational, the effects of COVID made a big impact on our ability to attract volunteers. We typically cap the number at 25 people but this year it was a struggle to find 8. These dedicated individuals usually consist of assistant superintendents from other properties and students studying to enter this field. They come due to their dedication to our profession and the ability to gain valuable PGA Tournament experience. This is a big commitment given they must work Sunday to Sunday where each day is a split shift working 4am to 9am and 3pm to 8pm. The decrease in volunteers coupled with a smaller staff (had several openings) really forced us to rethink how we typically prepare the course during tournament week. Having fewer people did not mean we could do less work. We were forced to find ways to be more efficient with the bodies we had. Needless to say, it was quite the streamlined operation that required a bit more effort and some creative thinking. In the end I believed we pulled it off quite well.

The condition of the golf course was right where we wanted it going into tournament week. We received about a ¹/₄" of rain early Wednesday morning that was not entirely welcome. A little bit of rain was ok given how dry we had been but that was a bit much where it softened the greens more than we would have liked. Also, the forecast at the time indicated the potential of substantial rain come Saturday. Luckily, we were able to dry down enough to provide firm conditions for Round 1 & 2. Saturday saw a large threat of rain and the radar did not look good that morning, but somehow we were spared when most of the rain basically split as it moved toward us missing us to the north and south. As one of our volunteers said, Mr. Palmer had his umbrella out.

For all 4 rounds we averaged green speeds of 13.5 ft. However, our firmness readings increased each day where on Sunday we were able to get readings that matched last year (our highest ever). Green speed and green firmness are not one in the same but obviously correlate. Green firmness is something that we have only been able to precisely measure in the past couple of years. Before that it was all based on "feel". But now by using both a moisture meter and a firmness meter we can monitor it to make the proper agronomic decisions. Given the decreased number of spectators, a smaller tournament build, and good weather we came out in the back side in very good condition.

With the return of golfers to the course, we continue to find ways to best manage the course and improve course conditions. As this relates to golf cart traffic control - we will be implementing the "Gate" system year-round. This is where we identify where you exit the cart path after leaving the tee. In the past we used countless sections of ropes/stakes and signage to steer you where we want you to go. This is both time consuming and costly to maintain plus it takes away from the aesthetics of the golf course. Instead, we want to try what we have been doing the past couple of years for those that required special access while we are cart path only leading into API. By using white stakes with a blue top, we identify where we want you to exit the cart path after leaving the tee complex. Each day, we can then move the stake based on traffic stress to maintain turf health.
