CARE FOR THE COURSES:

Please help us keep your golf course in its best possible condition: please repair your ball mark plus one other on every green. Sometimes you may have to check the front of the green to find your pitch mark. If the mark is not repaired immediately, it could take up to two weeks to heal. Please replace your divots or fill the divot with the sand mixture provided on your golf car. It is critical this time of year that we care for the course in this manner as these practices directly affect the course conditions for the Arnold Palmer Invitational.

Each year the PGA Tour asks us to place greater limits on the amount of play we allow leading up to the event. If we can minimize the wear and tear on the course and the regeneration time for ball marks and divots, hopefully we can eliminate the need for further play limitations.

CART PATH RESTRICTIONS:

We appreciate your assistance as we manage golf cart traffic in an effort to minimize wear in traditionally challenging areas. We will continue to restrict cart traffic on holes 5 & 13 plus two other holes (on a rotation basis) until February 11, at which time all holes will be closed to cart traffic.



KEEPIN' IT GREEN

With the busy golf season upon us and in preparing for the Arnold Palmer Invitational – managing the smallest of details becomes both a priority and a challenge. Golf course conditions continue to be favorable and the weather has been cooperating which should lead to another successful tournament. There are however many ways that you can assist us in our pursuit of maintaining high standards.

BALL MARK REPAIR

As a general rule, a ball mark repaired within 10 minutes will heal with a smooth surface within two to three days. An unrepaired ball mark may take as long as three weeks to heal, but the result will be an uneven surface.

REPLACING DIVOTS

Rules here will vary from course to course based on geography and grass types. As a general rule here, always replace the divot if possible. This way the patch of grass will quickly send down new roots. Try to replace the turf in the same direction it came out, and tap down firmly so a mower won't pull it back out. If not possible, then use the sand provided in the container on the golf car. Fill the divot hole and tamp down the sand with your foot.

RAKING BUNKERS

Bunkers pose enough trouble themselves let alone when they are left unraked. To avoid leaving a poor playing surface, follow these tips:

- Enter/exit at the point closest to your ball (unless it's a steep slope).
- Alternate between pulling the sand toward you and pushing it away from you to make the surface even.

One item that continues to be a topic of discussion is Rake Placement. We continue to place rakes "Tournament Style" where they are not to be in the line of play. This calls for no rakes being placed on the fairway, approach, or green side of any bunker. The drawback to this method is that by rakes only being put on the backside of the bunkers (in the rough) results in there being fewer rakes out there.

CART TRAFFIC

- Please pair up when possible to minimize the amount of carts out there
- Follow cart signs and other directional markers.
- Keep carts on the path at all Tee and Green complexes.
- When parking or making turns, keep all 4 tires on the path.

COMMUNICATION

Please share any concerns observations that you may have with myself or anyone from my team. The more eyes I have out there to identify issues the better. I appreciate all and any suggestions that results in improving the course/property and or the service we provide.

So as always, do not hesitate to contact me or flag me down out on the course to share your thoughts.

At the Arnold Palmer Golf Academy, we are always looking for ways to help our students improve their scores. A key component in learning to score better is to be able to consistently drive the ball in the fairway off the tee. There are always some critical tee shots that you have to hit on the course. Some holes are very narrow in the landing area, and there is trouble looming on one or both sides.

The good news is that you can make some small adjustments to better execute these shots when you really need to hit a good drive.

(Three) Keys at address to assist you on those tight holes would be to:

- 1. Tee the ball a little lower
- 2. Choke down on the club
- 3. Stand a little closer to the ball

During the swing, take a slightly more controlled swing and swing the club keeping your head steady. In Mr. Palmer's book, "Play Great Golf" Mr. Palmer states, "The most common fault I see among amateurs trying to pound the ball is their head movement". He states further, "If you're having trouble keeping your drives on the fairway, chances are you're suffering from head movement."

Good drivers of the ball generally have a good tempo and are able to maintain their balance during and after the shot. Keeping your head steady will help this process. A good rule of thumb is to swing at about 70% of your full power.

These adjustments will help you achieve a little more control off the tee. You will likely find that a fade ball flight will be the result, so plan for it. There is an old saying that "You can talk to a fade, but a hook won't listen!

Next time you are out of the course, try these suggestions and you will be hitting the fairway more often.

ARNOLD PALMER INVITATIONAL NOTES:

In our preparations for the Arnold Palmer Invitational, we will be limiting play during the month of February. With the following restrictions in place, demand for tee times will likely outpace supply, so please plan accordingly and take full advantage the 7-day advance tee time policy:

Monday, February 11 – Wednesday, February 27: Play will be limited to no more than 120 players (Feb 11- Feb 17) and 100 players (February 18-27), with the 1st tee closing at approximately 2:00 pm. As available tee times are reduced, it is necessary to curb the amount of guest play in order to provide course availability for members who wish to play. As such, the following restrictions on guest play will be instituted from February 18 – February 27:

February 18 - February 26: Maximum 1 guest per member

February 23: No guest play prior to 11:00am

February 27: No guests permitted

"CART PATH ONLY" RESTRICTIONS IN EFFECT FEB 11 - FEB 27.

Charger Course: Holes 1 & 9 will be close at Noon on February 5 (#8 will be converted to a par 3); the remaining holes will be available for play through February 24 unless circumstances dictate otherwise. The Charger is projected to reopen for play on April 2.

"API Tent Sale": Don't miss our annual clearance sale on Thursday, February 28 (9:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m.) in our main merchandise tent located next to the Golf Shop. This sale is open to members only – store credit and member charge will be the only forms of payment accepted.

Wednesday, March 13: Challenger/Champion reopens at Noon – double tee start

Area Golf Course "Specials" – February 28 – March 12: Arrangements have been made at local courses for our members to receive special accommodations during the week of the Arnold Palmer Invitational. Most of the courses will require our golf professional staff to arrange the tee times on your behalf. Please call the golf shop for a list of participating facilities.

Club Storage and Locker Cleaning: In order to accommodate the PGA Tour players during the week of the API, we ask that all male members with lockers please clean out your locker by 6:00 p.m., February 27. Members with club storage – if you will need your clubs March 3-12, please pick up your clubs by 6:00 p.m. March 2.




