ZACH'S SPIN

Thank you to everyone for a great start to 2020! We have hit the ground running and the courts have been busy with play. Please be sure to stay hydrated and do a proper warm up and stretch before and after you play.

I would like to remind everyone, with tournament right around the corner, parking is going to be very limited at the tennis facility and would be best to carpool with one another the week before and the week of tournament. After our home match on February 12, courts one and two will be closed until Saturday, March 21, so please be courteous to others and allow the next group to start on time. We have arranged for our members to play at Isleworth during this time. Please be sure to call Isleworth no earlier than 24 hours in advance and see if they have any openings. Saturday mornings they have a men's round robin and courts are available after 11:00 am. Reservation times are set as 1.5 hours for doubles and 1 hour for singles. Please be sure to give them the names of all members playing so you may enter through the front gate. We are grateful for Marco (Director of Tennis) and his staff for allowing us to use their facility, so please be sure to follow their rules and thank them if you get the opportunity.

With the end of our season fast approaching, we are already looking forward to forming teams for next year. Our rosters for the fall will be posted in April. If you are interested in participating on a Bay Hill Tennis Team, please contact the Tennis Pro Shop 876-8027 and our professional staff will gladly assist you with any questions.

We have had a few rules questions arise over the past few months and I would like to let everyone know how to correct an issue that may come up during play. As a principle, when an error in respect of the Rules of Tennis is discovered, all points previously played shall stand.

Errors so discovered shall be corrected as follows:

A. During a standard game or a tie-break game, if a player serves from the wrong half of the court, this should be corrected as soon as the error is discovered and the server shall serve from the correct half of the court according to the score. A fault that was served before the error was discovered shall stand.

B. During a standard game or a tie-break game, if the players are at the wrong ends of the court, the error should be corrected as soon as it is discovered and the server shall serve from the correct end of the court according to the score.

C. If a player serves out of turn during a standard game, the player who was originally due to serve shall serve as soon as the error is discovered. However, if a game is completed before the error is discovered the order of service shall remain as altered. In this case, any ball change to be made after an agreed number of games should be made one game later than originally scheduled. A fault that was served by the opponents(s) before the error was discovered shall not stand. In doubles, if the partners of one team serve out of turn, a fault that was served before the error was discovered shall stand.

D. If a player serves out of turn during a tie-break game and the error is discovered after an even number of points have been played, the error is corrected immediately. If the error is discovered after an odd number of points have been played, the order of service shall remain as altered. A fault that was served by the opponent(s) before the error was discovered shall not stand. In doubles, if the partners of one team serve out of turn, a fault that was served before the error was discovered shall stand.

E. During a standard game or a tie-break game in doubles, if there is an error in the order of receiving, this shall remain as altered until the end of the game in which the error is discovered. For the next game in which they are the receivers in that set, the partners shall then resume the original order of receiving.

CARE FOR THE COURSES:

Please help us keep your golf course in its best possible condition: please repair your ball mark plus one other on every green. Sometimes you may have to check the front of the green to find your pitch mark. If the mark is not repaired immediately, it could take up to 2 weeks to heal. Please replace your divots or fill the divot with the sand

mixture provided on your golf car. It is critical this time of year that we care for the course in this manner as these practices directly affect the course conditions for the Arnold Palmer Invitational.

Each year the PGA Tour asks us to place greater limits on the amount of play we allow leading up to the event. If we can minimize the wear and tear on the course and the regeneration time for ball marks and divots, hopefully we can eliminate the need for further play limitations.

CART PATH RESTRICTIONS:

We appreciate your assistance as we manage golf cart traffic in an effort to minimize wear in traditionally challenging areas. We will continue to restrict cart traffic on holes 5 & 13 plus two other holes (on a rotation basis) until February 10, at which time all holes will be closed to cart traffic.

KEEPIN' IT GREEN

With the API looming, months of planning and preparations always seem to be a race to the finish. From critical areas such as the condition of our greens, to the smallest of details like edging cart paths - time is such a precious commodity.

The importance of having the golf course in pristine condition for the tournament can be a challenge when maintaining the balance of meeting expectations for daily play in the months prior. Most often the deciding factor is the impact of the weather. Thus far, our biggest test was an unseasonable stretch of wet, cloudy conditions in December. Prolonged, high soil moisture levels along with a lack of sunlight resulted in weak, thinning turf on several of the greens. We had to react instituting strategies to both reduce stress and to promote recovery. After a few weeks of some TLC and some help from Mother Nature the health of the greens drastically improved.

While turf conditions are the focus, we must equally pay attention to an array of details that are all important in making Bay Hill shine. Items such as adding new sand to bunkers, ball mark repair, filling fairway divots, and edging ponds all require additional time to be "Tour ready." Our team here has done an outstanding job and I am excited about how the condition of the golf course is taking shape. Let's hope for some more favorable weather as we come down the home stretch.

Aside from our focus to turf conditions, we have also been paying attention to some furry visitors. Starting in December we began to see on almost a daily basis a pair of coyotes roaming the property & neighborhood.



Coyotes are remarkable in that they can adapt very easily to almost any environment. They are largely active at dawn & dusk but can be seen at any time. They are attracted by the availability of food such as rodents, insects, and scavenged material. It is imperative to not feed them as they could become too comfortable and lose their fear of humans. Therefore you must secure all attractants (pet food, garbage, bird seed, fallen fruit, etc.).

Coyotes are generally not a threat to people and are usually easily scared off. Small pets can sometimes be at risk, especially if left outside unattended. If outside, pets should be on a short leash or within a fenced area as long as the fence is over 6 feet tall and the bottom is secure from being able to dig under.

Killing or removing (trapping) coyotes from a landscape where they are not currently causing problems is discouraged by Florida Fish & Game as it is not considered a longterm solution. Coyotes are highly organized in their social structure and live in family groups consisting of one mated Alpha pair and Beta individuals that help raise young. Removing one or two will disrupt that hierarchy and cause more young to be born at a faster rate as the Betas vie for and to try to replace the Alpha position that you are likely to eliminate (because Alphas are the more active and visible group members).

Coyotes are actually beneficial to the ecosystem and like the other wildlife found here should be should be able to coexist. However, it is best that we all are catious and employ practices that do not lessen their natural fear of humans.

ARNOLD PALMER INVITATIONAL NOTES:

In our preparations for the Arnold Palmer Invitational, we will be limiting play during the month of February. With the following restrictions in place, demand for tee times will likely outpace supply, so please plan accordingly and take full advantage the 7-day advance tee time policy:

Monday, February 10 - Wednesday, February 26:

Play will be limited to no more than 120 players (Feb 10- Feb 16) and 100 players (February 17-26), with the 1st tee closing at approximately 2:00 pm. As available tee times are reduced, it is necessary to curb the amount of guest play in order to provide course availability for members who wish to play. As such, the following restrictions on guest play will be instituted from February 17 – February 26:

February 17– February 25: Maximum 1 guest per member

February 22: No guest play prior to 11:00am

February 26: No guests permitted

"Cart Path Only" restrictions will be in effect Feb 10 – Feb 26.

Charger Course: Holes 1 & 9 will be close at Noon on February 4 (#8 will be converted to a par 3); the remaining holes will be available for play through February 23 unless circumstances dictate otherwise. The Charger is projected to reopen for play approximately April 4th.

Tuesday, March 10:

Challenger/Champion reopens at Noon – double tee start

Club Storage and Locker Cleaning:

In order to accommodate the PGA Tour players during the week of the API, we ask that all male members with lockers please clean out your locker by 6:00 p.m., Wednesday, February 26th. Members with club storage – if you will need your clubs March 1-9, please pick up your clubs by 6:00 p.m. February 29th.

Golf Cart Usage During API Week:

Please note, Bay Hill Club Members are prohibited from driving their carts on property before 6pm throughout tournament week. Carts must follow the same rules as vehicles. No parking will be permitted in the Club's main parking lot, in the on-course parking lot or in the marina parking lot (violators will be towed.)


